

So, although my full name is Jemima Samantha Leverton, I have always been called Jim Jam.



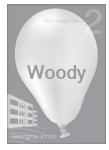
